

**NOTICE OF OPPORTUNITIES TO SERVE ON
ADVISORY COMMITTEES ON MAINE RULES OF COURT**

The Maine Supreme Judicial Court is pleased to announce the planned creation of an **Advisory Committee on the Maine Rules of Appellate Procedure**, and invites interest from attorneys who would like to be considered for membership on the new Committee. Attorneys will serve renewable staggered four-year terms and can expect three or four half-day meetings per year.

In addition, the **Advisory Committee on the Maine Rules of Unified Criminal Procedure** and the **Advisory Committee on the Maine Rules of Evidence** have several vacancies.

Additionally, attorneys with experience in family law practice in the Probate Courts are invited to express interest in positions on the **Advisory Committee on the Maine Rules of Probate Procedure** or the **Probate and Trust Law Advisory Committee (PATLAC)**.

Because vacancies can arise in other Advisory Committees, attorneys are also welcome to express interest in serving on other committees not mentioned above. Time commitments for the Advisory Committees will vary based on unique demands.
