THE YEAR IN REVIEW

Waldo Judicial Center Scheduled to Open in March

The Waldo Judicial Center will be open for business in March, 2019. The brand new facility is a twostory brick and granite courthouse that will house both the Belfast District Court, currently located in a 1930's-era building, and the Superior Court, located in a separate historic building dating from 1853. The WJC, like its predecessors, is located in downtown Belfast, but features adjacent public and staff parking, enhanced security and



entrance screening, an additional courtroom, improved jury deliberation rooms, and additional conference rooms for the public. The building was designed with high efficiency heating, cooling, lighting, and other technologies.

The support of the 127th Maine Legislature, including Senate President Michael Thibodeau, and Governor LePage was critical to the success of this project, as was the assistance and collaboration of Waldo County government officials and members of Belfast city government.

The focused work of Mark Carter of North Peak Architecture, and the General Contractor, Ganneston Construction Corp., as well as the oversight of the Facilities Team, led by Justice Robert Murray, resulted in the substantial completion of construction in just over a year — on February 11, 2019. The courthouse is expected to be officially open to the public, on time and well within budget, as scheduled in March 2019.

All entrances to the new 38,000 square foot facility are fully handicapped accessible, with improved acoustics and technology in the courtrooms and common areas, including wireless internet access. The Waldo County District Attorney's Office has leased a designated space on the first floor. The building includes two jury courtrooms, one non-jury courtroom and mediation room spaces.

A ribbon cutting ceremony will be held in early April.

Violations Bureau First to Implement Odyssey E-filing

After months of careful planning and testing, the Maine court system's new case management and e-filing system, Odyssey, went "live" for traffic violation cases statewide on October 22, 2018. Individuals are now able to look up a ticket, pay it, or take other action on their cases 24 hours a day, seven days a week using the online system. Parties may still file answers, motions, and documents by mail.






GENERAL FUND AND JUDICIAL BRANCH EXPENDITURES

FY18 REVENUE






REVENUE DISTRIBUTED BY THE JUDICIAL BRANCH
